
JPIAMR Regional Workshop Eastern Europe

The role of a Joint Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda at global level for tackling AMR

Bucharest, Romania, 5-6 December 2019





Background and workshop objectives

The Joint Programming Initiative on Antibiotic Resistance (JPIAMR) is an international collaborative platform that coordinates national research funding, multi-dimensional AMR research and funding on a global scale and supports collaborative action for filling knowledge gaps on AMR with a One Health perspective. It brings together 27-member nations and the European Commission. The JPIAMR aims at unifying research efforts globally in order to answer this public health priority issue, avoiding fragmentation and scattering of resources.

Romania is a full JPIAMR member, participating in its efforts to elaborate a Joint Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda by consultation of member state experts, extending JPIAMR and building the One Health JPIAMR-Virtual Research Institute.

This 1.5-day workshop targeted the policy making level with the aim to explore opportunities for putting together EU and global experience and sharing resources and achievements in order to find sustainable solutions for tackling AMR in the Eastern Europe Region. Speakers came from different European countries and shared their experiences.

The workshop was held in Bucharest, Romania on the 5-6th December 2019.



Hosted by the <u>Cantacuzino Institute in Bucharest</u>, Romania, the workshop was supported by JPIAMR and the Romania Defence Ministry. The workshop was chaired by the Romanian Minister of Agriculture and attended by the Secretaries of State of Environment and Public Health, as well as high level representatives from the ministries of Education and Research and Defence.

Laura Marin and Patriq Fagerstedt represented JPIAMR. There were participants from ECDC, experts from JPIAMR EU member countries, as well as representatives from Moldavia and Lithuania. The focus of the workshop was to increase AMR intergovernmental collaboration with a One Health approach, how to implement the SRIA and the further development of the JPIAMR-Virtual Research Institute.

Media coverage

Many media representatives from television, radio and newspapers attended the workshop. Several speakers as well as government representatives were interviewed. The event created a high impact on both at a political level as well as on media coverage, raising awareness on the antimicrobial resistance challenge in a One Heath perspective as well as actions and solutions for its mitigation.
