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# Goals of Strategic Research Agenda

- To bring together all players in the field for a multi-dimensional and multidisciplinary approach
- To provide a platform for partners to collaborate in a tailor-made fashion on specific topics
- To harmonise joint actions and create greater impact
- To reduce research overlaps
- To align research programmes
- To create awareness and knowledge
- To stand a chance of actually finding solutions to the AMR problem

# Steps in developing SRA – step 1

**May 2011**

First workshop by JPIAMR to identify – from a scientific perspective:

- Major needs, and
  - Greatest challenges
- on antimicrobial resistance.

- **Establishment of the Scientific Advisory Board (SAB) to further develop these needs and challenges into the SRA.**

## Steps in developing SRA – step 2

### 2011 - 2013

- Meetings (5x) of SAB to further discuss and define needs and challenges
- Document analysis
- Research output mapping at general EU level
- Research funding mapping among member countries (first draft)
- **Establishment of National Expert Panels in all the member countries**
- **1<sup>st</sup> draft of SRA at the beginning of 2013**

## Steps in developing SRA – step 3

### 2013

- Consultation process with stakeholders to discuss and deliver input to the first draft of the SRA:
- Establishment of the Stakeholder Advisory Board (SHAB)
- Discussion and feedback on SRA by SHAB in April 2013

### ➤ **2<sup>nd</sup> draft of SRA**

Stakeholder Conference (Geneva, May 2013) with representatives from Management Board, Scientific Board, Stakeholder Board; additional AMR experts (with different backgrounds and from different countries)

# Steps in developing SRA – step 4

**2012 – 2013**

Expert workshops:

- Series of scientific topic specific workshops (2012)
- Workshop on veterinary perspective on AMR (2013)
- Brainstorm workshop with AMR experts (2013) at the FEMS conference

➤ **3<sup>rd</sup> draft of SRA**

# Steps in developing SRA – step 5

**2013**

Second round of consultations on SRA 3<sup>rd</sup> draft:

- Online public consultation process via questionnaires (September 1 – October 15 2013)
- National expert panels input of member countries
- Input from SHAB

➤ **Final draft of SRA**

# Steps in developing SRA – final steps

## 2013 – 2014

- Finalisation of SRA by SAB (November 2013)
- Editing, lay-out by and communication materials
- Approval by Management Board in December 2013

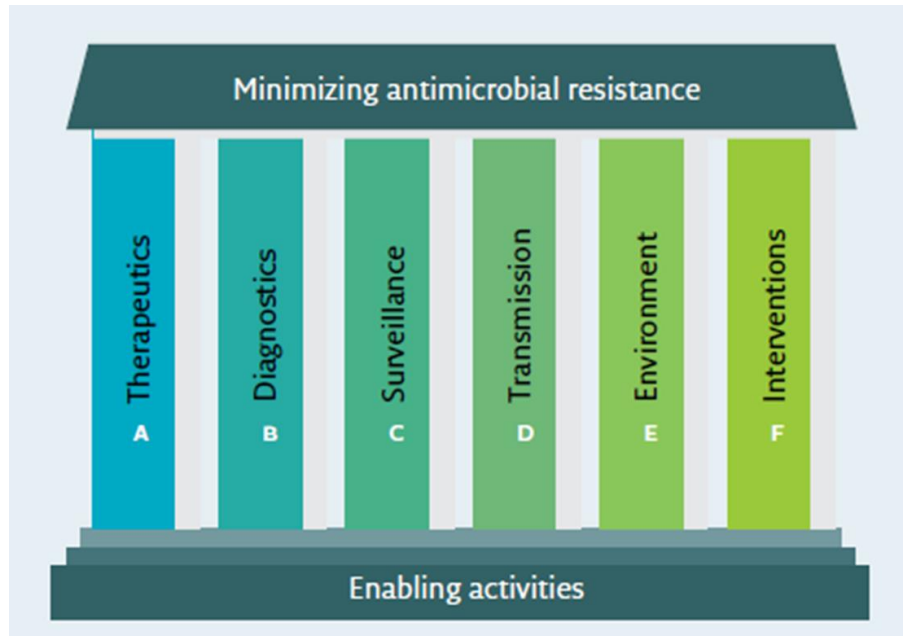
## ➤ **SRA launch in April 2014**

SRA launch conference: “Implementing a Global Research Agenda for AMR”, Brussels, April 3, 2014



## SRA's priority topics

- To form a comprehensive approach for studies into strategies to reduce the use of antibiotics
- To minimise the emergence and spread of antibiotic resistant genes and bacteria
- To aim to reduce the AMR burden



## SRA Update

- Add innovation to SRA => SRiA
- Alignment with:
  - other SR(i)A's
  - stakeholders / industry
  - national action plans
  - WHO Global Action Plan
  - Etc.

## SRA Update

- Establishing an Editorial Board
- SAB review of the pillars
- Adding innovation
- Rewriting the SRiA
- Open consultation (autumn 2018)
- Finalising SRiA (December 2018)
- Roadmap prioritisation (early 2019)
